2 Common Documents

Faculty introduce common documents such as confidentiality agreements, then review current laws on particular clauses and how to avoid some major redlining mistakes that we have seen in our profession. You will walk away with a short guide on things to always look for in an agreement.

3 Logistics and Ethics

This session focuses on applicable logistics and ethics, including redlining etiquette, best billing practices of time entries, balancing firm policies with ethical obligations for billing entries, and some practical exercises on billing entries.
