5 Copyright Updates: Impacts of the Andy Warhol Decision

In May, the Supreme Court decided that Andy Warhol did not enjoy fair use protections for his interpretation of a famous photograph of the artist once known as Prince, then known as something unpronounceable, then known as Prince again. At the heart of the case was the question of whether "the purpose and character of the use, including whether such use is of a commercial nature" supported a finding of fair use. Ultimately, the Supreme Court held that it did not because the commercial natures of the two works were too similar. What troubles does this case portend for current artists using cutting-edge technologies? How will the Warhol decision affect budding generative-Al visual artists going forward? We will consider these questions.
